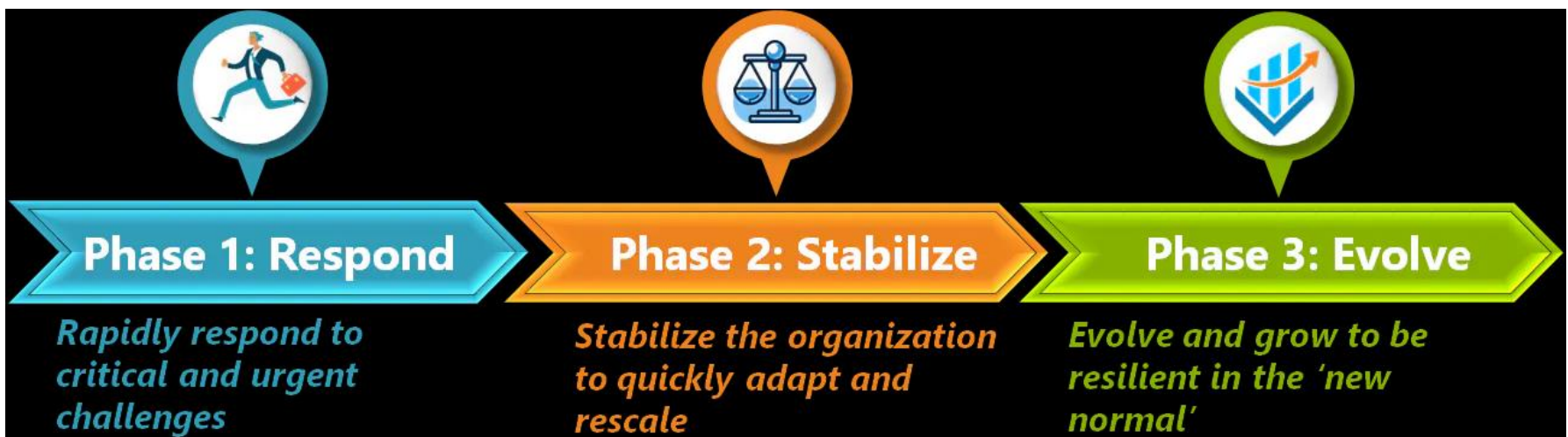

- 3) **Post-crisis:** restore/learn/evolve/rebound



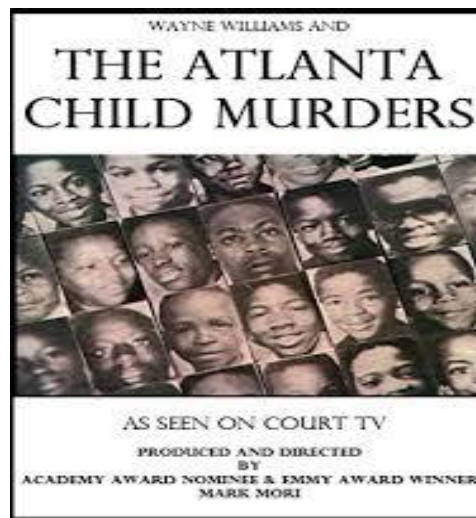

The Executive Order institutes a 14 day Stay at Home Order within territorial jurisdictional limits of the City of Atlanta in response to the rising number of COVID-19 infections.

The Stay at Home Order requires Atlantans to remain in their homes throughout the day. Individuals may leave their place of residence only for essential activities, essential governmental functions or to operate essential businesses. This order shall be effective on **March 24, 2020 at midnight.**

Celebrate safely during #IndependenceDay— stop the spread of #COVID19 by following the simple guidelines below. #ATLStrong #OneAtlanta

ATL CELEBRATE SAFELY DURING INDEPENDENCE DAY - STAY HEALTHY, STAY SAFE!

- MAINTAIN GOOD SOCIAL DISTANCE (ABOUT 6 FEET)**
 - Stay at least 6 feet from other people. Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread the virus.
- WASH YOUR HANDS**
 - Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- COVER YOUR MOUTH AND NOSE WITH A CLOTH FACE COVER**
 - You could spread COVID-19 to others even if you do not feel sick. Everyone should wear a cloth face cover when they have to go out in public.
- CLEAN AND DISINFECT**
 - Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.
- MONITOR YOUR HEALTH**
 - Be alert for symptoms. Watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms of COVID-19. If you think you may have been exposed to COVID-19, contact your health provider and get tested.
